## **Hormel Foundation Announces Contributions Exceeding \$4.2 Million**

AUSTIN, Minn. (Nov. 20, 2009) — The Hormel Foundation recently approved more than \$4.2 million in contributions for 2010. Since inception, the Foundation has contributed in excess of \$77 million to the Austin area.

The University of Minnesota's Hormel Institute is the principal recipient of The Hormel Foundation's contributions, as established in 1942 by an agreement between the board of regents of the University of Minnesota and The Hormel Foundation. Funds received by The Hormel Institute are used to conduct research and education in the biological sciences. Institute research projects currently relate to heart disease, cancer, diabetes and obesity. The Institute derives most of its operating budget through grants and contracts from the National Institute of Health and other agencies.
